FRANCIS E. AND FREELAN O. STANLEY

Francis and Freelan were twin brothers who were born in 1847 in Maine. While they are most popularly known for their invention of the Stanley Steamer, they also had several other successes including the invention of dry photographic plates, the airbrush, and the formation of the Stanley Hotel which was later featured in the novel "The Shining" written by famed author Stephen King.

Francis and Freelan were born into a family of seven children to middle-income parents who lived on a farm. The two were always mechanically inclined, but it was their invention for dry photographic plates that got them their "business" start. After receiving a patent for the plates, they built a factory in Newton, Massachusetts to manufacture them. They eventually sold their idea to George Eastman (Kodak) and made a small fortune.

After selling their patents, the brothers turned their interest to automotives. According to rumor, their interest was peaked in vehicle production when they attended a local fair and witnessed the power of a steam-driven vehicle. The rumor would state that Francis's wife could not ride a bicycle, and he wanted to invent something that she could ride. From here on in, the brothers turned their focus to developing a steam powered vehicle of their own.

Francis and Freelan built their first steam-powered vehicle in 1897. By 1898 they had formed their own car company. Their first car ran at 35 miles per hour and was a huge success.

The brothers had their own factory and were producing over 10 cars a day.

A few months later the brothers sold their business for a quarter of a million dollars (which was a huge sum of money in the day). Unfortunately, the business was unsuccessful thereafter. With that said, the brothers shortly decided to buy back the business, for only a small fraction of which they sold it (\$20,000).



They renamed the company the "Stanley Motor Carriage Company". Their new vehicles became popularly known as "Stanley Steamers".

The brothers hosted many events by which to advertise their new vehicle. Races were common, and in 1906 the Stanley Steamer set a new world record for traveling over 130 miles per hour. After one race, witnesses say that the Stanley Steamer flew into the air and when it landed it

broke into two. From there, it gained the nickname of the "Flying Teapot".

Freelan, who suffered from tuberculosis, eventually moved to a small town of Estes Park in Colorado for the good of his health. Many people had doubted that his Stanley Steamer could make it up the treacherous hills in Estes Park, but Freelan was determined to prove them wrong. He did.



In 1909, Freelan loved Estes Park so much that he decided to build the Stanley Hotel there. The hotel was built on 140 acres of land and designed by Freelan himself. The hotel was phenomenal and included a power plant, a casino, tennis courts, a golf course, a shooting range, and even a small airfield. It cost over \$500,000 to build.

While both brothers are now passed, the Stanley Hotel still stands today and is designated a National Historic Landmark. It has two original Stanley Steamers, one within the hotel lobby and one used for tours. The hotel is popularly known for its role in "The Shining" and is open for reservations.

ROLLIN' 'CROSS THE RIVER

Yes, after holding several meets in Moline, IL, we are moving across the Mighty Mississippi River to Bettendorf, IA. Located on the banks of the river, it is one of the "Quad Cities" of Moline, Rock Island, IL, Davenport, and Bettendorf, IA. In the heart of the Midwest, Bettendorf was incorporated in 1903 when the Bettendorf Brothers moved their Iron Wagon business from Davenport to what was then named Bettendorf. Thriving industrialists William and Joseph opened the Bettendorf Company, which had many branches including the Meteor Automobile Plant. Produced from 1907 - 1912, it featured a 50 h.p. engine, 4 forward speeds and 2 reverse. All but the tires and electrical system were manufactured on site, later sold to J.I. Case Company, now the site of the Isle Hotel.

Our Headquarters, The Isle Hotel, Casino, and Convention Center offers all meet requirements on site, show field, meeting rooms, free trailer parking and easy access to all attractions. Come, relax, and enjoy what the Quad Cities has to offer. Try your luck in the Casino, or dine in one of its fine restaurants.

Attractions

Thursday - Take a leisurely eight-mile drive to LeClaire, IA. At your own pace visit Antique Archaeology, "Home of the Pickers", the Buffalo Bill Museum, honoring his birth place in 1846 or take one of the tours through the Mississippi River Distilling Company, dine at one of the fine restaurants overlooking the Mississippi, shop for antiques and other unique items in the quaint downtown, all conveniently within walking distance or park in one of the many free parking lots.

The evening brings a free Dessert Buffet featuring the home cooking of the Mississippi Valley Region and cash bar. Maps and brochures will be available Thursday morning.

Friday - Design your own tour to John Deere Commons or John Deere Headquarters, the Village of East

Davenport, the I-80 Truck Museum, Arsenal Islands historic swing span/Lock and Dam 15 tours or perhaps some local automobile collections.

After returning, board the Celebration Belle for a 2 ½ Hour Buffet Cruise featuring Prime Rib, Live Music, Dancing or just relaxing on one of the three decks.
