Calvin Edwin Frels September 14, 1924 - May 19, 2016

Calvin Edwin Frels, 91, of rural Hillsdale, IL, (Osborn proper) and Moline, passed away at 12:20 PM on Thursday, May 19, 2016 at Genesis Medical Center, Illini Campus, Silvis. Funeral Services will be held at 10:00 AM on May 31st at Gibson – Bode Funeral Home, Port Byron. Visitation will be from 5-8 PM on May 30th at the funeral home. Burial will be in the Oakwood Cemetery, Geneseo. Memorials may be made to Rock Island County 4-H, c/o The University of Illinois Extension Office, 321 - 2nd Ave, Milan, IL 61264.

Mr. Frels was born September 14, 1924 in Osborn, Illinois. He was the son of Edwin Carl and Eunice Elizabeth Osborn Frels. He married Lois Parnell of East

Moline, IL, on October 28, 1950 in Clinton, IA. They celebrated their 65th wedding anniversary in 2015.


Mr. Frels was a lifetime farmer and retired in 1988. He graduated from the Osborn School and Geneseo High School. Mr. Frels was a licensed real estate salesperson. Mr. Frels was active in local politics. He served as a multi-township assessor for Zuma and Canoe Creek Townships for 16 years. He also served as Zuma Township Trustee for more than 20 years. Calvin served as a trustee for the Rock Island County Township Organization. He was a candidate for the Rock Island County Board in 1976. He served for 20 years as a member of the Rock Island County Fair Board. He was a 4-H leader and served as a volunteer track coach for Riverdale Schools.

For more than 30 years, Calvin served as Commissioner for the Hampton/Zuma Drainage District. He enjoyed antique tractors, antique cars and his farm. He especially enjoyed his grandchildren. Mr. Frels served two terms on the Board of Directors of the Mississippi Valley Regional Antique Automobile Club. He was a life-long member of the Illinois and Rock Island County Farm Bureau.

Mr. Frels is survived by his wife, Dr. Lois Frels; 2 sons and daughters-in-law, Mark Edwin and Ann Renee Harding Frels of Wyanet, IL (formerly Bloomington, IL) and Arlan James "AJ" and Anita Willis Frels and 2 grandchildren, Garrett Calvin and Kathryn Marie all of Gardnerville, NV (formerly of Mosinee, WI); and brother-in-law and sister-in-law, Orville and Cheryl Parnell of Davenport, IA. He was preceded in death by his parents; a brother, John Dederick Frels; sisters, Myrtle May Frels Guldenpfennig, and Nora Louise Frels Ruhnow.
