
President's Message

Minutes of the last MVR Board meeting in June of 2020 were approved as published in the Autograph.

Treasurer's reports for Year End 2020 and January 2021 were approved and filed for audit.

Sunshine: Sympathy cards have been mailed to member families during this time. Roster: no reports

Membership – 125 members – down 8 from 2019. We have lost 6 MVR members due to the virus or other. Gary Gleason completed the annual membership report as required by AACA.

Webmaster – Mark Lousberg reported on behalf of Dwayne Cederblom that he still needs photos of members' cars. He seeking a program that would allow images to cycle in a better way.

OLD BUSINESS:

Members who participated in last year's mini tours and picnic venues reported they enjoyed the tours and mealtimes. However, we need to also find ways to publicize our club to the public during the year.

NEW BUSINESS:

The National Meet scheduled for August 11-13, 2022 was fully discussed in order to make a definitive selection of a meet hotel and car show venue. The Board voted to hold the 2022 event at The Bend Event Center and Hyatt House Hotel (99 rooms) in East Moline, IL., with the car display/judging held inside the auction building. The motion to formalize the agreement was made by John Brewer, seconded by Fred Bartemeyer. The building can hold 125 cars, with a snack bar, restrooms, meeting rooms, display rooms, A/C, exhaust venting, security, etc. All required components of a national meet can be held inside. Rental is \$1,000/day, needed for Friday and Saturday. Ample trailer parking is available on the grounds and nearby on private lots. Hotel rooms are \$129/night incl. breakfast, with 300 room nights reserved. The Bend also offers outdoor concerts in the nearby band shell. Additional discussion involved Thursday night's Hospitality event and the awards ceremony. A tour of the facilities for anyone is Sat., Feb. 20th at 11 a.m.

My first antique car was a 1974 Corvette but it was 15 years old when I bought it so it wasn't an antique. I kept that car for 24 years though so it became my first antique car.

The Vette was a fun driver and I put 3000 miles on it every summer. It was a No-Extras car having just the Deluxe interior which was leather seats with wood inserts on the doors. The windows were manual as were the door locks. It was the L48 350 CU IN engine with an automatic transmission.

Why a Vette? I always wanted one and this one fell into my lap. It was sitting on 4th Avenue in Moline by Riverside pool and my dad saw it and called me. I came down to check it out and couldn't believe the price. I wondered what was wrong with it. (I learned later about mid-70s Corvette pricing being soft.) I drove it and loved it. It was a Corvette and that was all that mattered. I used it as a second car, on weekends, after work and only in nice weather.

I sold it 8 years ago to get the 83 Buick Riviera Convertible. The proceeds from selling The Vette were just enough to pay for the Buick, so it was really a straight trade. For me the Riviera was always a car to be had. Growing up around cars and going to Buick shows with my Dad influenced me and the Riviera was a goal of mine.

Former Cadillac Stamping Plant to be Demolished

NorthPoint Development and LoPatin & Co. have announced plans to redevelop the 44.8-acre site of the former Cadillac Stamping Plant located one-half mile south of the Coleman A. Young International Airport in Detroit.

The project will include the demolition of an abandoned factory (9501 Conner Ave.) and the construction of a new 684,000 square foot Class A industrial building targeted toward automotive suppliers and advanced manufacturing and logistics opportunities. The project addresses the lack of manufacturing space in the region, which has been a hindrance in attracting large corporate tenants. It will likely open in the next 18 months.

"This abandoned industrial site will be remediated of hazardous materials, the structure will be demolished, and the new building will create hundreds of jobs and tax revenue for the city, county, and state," says Tim Conder, director of development of NorthPoint in Kansas City. "This redevelopment is a win-win for the city of Detroit and the residents of this community."



The City of Detroit Brownfield Redevelopment Authority received Michigan Strategic Fund (MSF) approval of \$3.3 million in state tax capture to reimburse for eligible Brownfield remediation activities, which makes redevelopment of the site possible.

The property has a history of manufacturing uses dating to 1919, when the Knodell Division of Clayton and Lambert Manufacturing Co. established an automotive stamping and metal working plant to supply various automakers. In 1925, it was sold to Hudson Motor Car Co. (Hudson's department store fame), which used it for manufacturing cars. It was later sold to Cadillac, which made car body panels at the site.

From there, it was sold in 1993 to Ivan Doverspike, who used the plant to build machine tools, followed by a storage operation. Businessman Bill Hults acquired the property in 1993, and he announced plans to build modular homes inside the facility, but the deal never materialized.

The new owners state they will undertake an extensive cleanup of the soil, asbestos removal, and demolition of the site. The project will also include the improvement of public sidewalks on the property.

"This project will bring an underutilized site back to productivity, creating skilled trades job opportunities in Detroit and supporting business expansion efforts in key industries to bring increased economic prosperity for the region," says Josh Hundt, chief business development officer and executive vice president on the Michigan Economic Development Corp.

The city of Detroit is supporting the project with the local portion of the Act 381 Work Plan request valued at \$4.7 million and an anticipated 12-year Industrial Facilities Tax Exemption valued at \$8.1 million. The developer plans to work with the Detroit at Work career center for hiring with a commitment to give preference to city residents.
