Studebaker Corporate Headquarters

South Bend, IN

After being vacant for nineteen years there's renewed interest in preserving the former Studebaker corporate headquarters.

Developer Kevin Smith is redeveloping nearly a million square feet of former Studebaker factory in the Renaissance District. He has now turned his attention to the former corporate headquarters at 635 S. Main Street.

The South Bend Redevelopment Commission has brokered a deal to stabilize the building. Multiple sources will provide \$3.3 million to be used for a new roof and to cover missing windows with the goal being to stop water intrusion. \$825,000 of the funds, to identify and remove asbestos and lead, will come from the city.


