A Morning at Mohr's Standard



At the Bettendorf, Iowa corner of State and 35th Streets sits the iconic Mohr's Standard service station. On the morning of October 20th the members of the MVR were treated to a tour of the third generation family-owned treasure.

Built in 1932 as a Standard station, the operation sat on the busy US 67 Highway making it a key stop for travelers heading North and South through Iowa. Mohr's station provided fuel, maintenance and repairs for their customers. Through the years it has worn Union 76 colors, and been a John Deere dealership then a Ford tractor dealership both while still operating as a service station.

Operations as a gas station and dealership ended in the mid-1980s. Now the station has a life as a repair shop for the Mohr's excavating business equipment and occasional hobby shop for Pat Mohr and his son Charlie to work on their muscle car collection.








Third generation owner Pat Mohr, (standing in the doorway) begins the tour by detailing the history of the station.
