


Following the memorabilia tour the group moved to Rockwood State Park for a lunch of grilled chicken breasts with bacon and cheese and all the fixin's.

2025 Hershey notes from a novice

AACA Hershey World, I attended with Jan's motor home loaded with all car parts that I don't need. Tired of looking at it all!!! Sold all the Trippe lights I restored plus 95% of what I took. Discovered after I lowered my price expectations, things sold! Great talking with buyers explaining some of my seldom seen items and learning some things.

My trip was not without unexpected events... Short story is I had an overheating event when I arrived in Hershey driving around slowly. I pulled into my two spaces and next to me were two guys who learned about my problem. The one guy, Sid, looked at the motor and spun the fan easily and said that was likely my issue along with a seepage from the upper radiator hose. The guy who held the lot of spaces I, Sid's and Rob Wolfe were in got involved and had his brother who owned a local parts store order a fan clutch, thermostat, radiator cap and two gallons of antifreeze at discount. Replacing all parts the next day solved the issue all due to all the supportive help I got at Hershey!

It rained hard Tuesday night so when it cleared in the morning I put stuff out on two tables and was selling again! Headed out Wednesday night and stopped to rest for few hours. Started out again Thursday and after a couple hours noticed power was down. Thought it may be the fuel filter mounted to the carb so I asked Google for nearest O Rielys and ended up in New Castle, Indiana. At this very busy intersection it stalled right in the middle. There was a car dealer there and they pulled me in. Checked it over and alternator was shot. They ordered another big frame one and after waiting 6 hours found out the mounting was wrong. Hummm, just needs electricity... so I could run the 110V generator that charges the house batteries through an inverter. So I just need a wire from positive on those batteries to positive on the chassis batteries. Well that's how I finally made it home in a 48-year-old motor home.

Being a first timer, one challenge was the way the spaces are arranged with what I felt was not well thought out. I read all the vendor rules and everyone does exactly as they please. Porta Pots are there only if someone orders them...say, in your group. They are mostly locked so good luck finding one open that a group forgot to lock. They should have some that AACA furnishes for general use and marked as such. By their tents they even locked them up. Noticed lots of blank spaces and or selling spaces were taken up just for parking with nothing out to sell. Looked like at most ¼ of spaces had items for sale. They could reorganize so selling spaces would be concentrated near the center of each area with sellers parking around the edges or at least limit general parking in selling area. This would cut down on going down a long isle and finding three spaces selling. Also, like brands or years could be arranged in different fields to cut down on walking whole areas.

Well it was an experience and I only bought parts for the motor home in order to safely get back home. Got rid of the excess and met a lot of great people who helped me so a good positive!

Was great to have Eric there along with Stu and Kathy and the Perry's!
