BUDDY L - "TOYS FOR BOYS"

Buddy L toys were born from a father's wish to find a toy that his adventurous four-year-old son could not unintentionally break. The father was Fred A. Lundhal, owner of Moline Pressed Steel Company in East Moline. The company produced stamped steel parts for various American automobile companies and International Harvester. The son was Arthur who went by the nickname Buddy L. The "L" distinguished Buddy



from several other children in the area with the same nickname. Not being able to find a toy to meet the indestructibility challenge, Lundhal decided to create one from left over steel scraps. The result was a 2-foot long all steel toy truck. The following year when Buddy L turned five, Lundhal created a steel dump truck for his son. It was not long before requests for these large sturdy toys were made from neighborhood youngsters and their parents. These requests led to the founding of one of the largest toy companies in America. In 1921 Lundhal converted part of his machine shop to toy making and named the line Buddy L after his son. It was not long before production shifted to all toys including cars, dump trucks, delivery vans, fire engines, construction equipment, and trains. Size and quality were hallmarks of the toys. Some were large enough for a child to straddle, propelling himself along with his feet. Many had real working parts like crank turned buckets or a compressed air piston that would raise the bed of a dump truck. The details were impressive: rubber tires or caterpillar treads, realistic lacquered paint jobs and an identifying decal. Marketed as "Toys for Boys", Lundhal took his designs to the New York City toy show in 1922. Despite a relatively high selling price of \$5.00 for many of the items, F.A.O. Schwartz and Marshall Field placed sizable orders and promoted the toys in their stores throughout the 1920's. The toys could also be ordered from the Sears & Roebuck catalog. The Buddy L dump truck cost \$3.98. For almost ten years, Fred Lundhal enjoyed the growth and success of his company. Unfortunately, in 1930 he died from surgical complications. The company was sold, and the name was changed to Buddy "L" Manufacturing. Fortunately, the toys continued to be produced to Lundhal's standards and production stayed in East Moline. Things were running smoothly until the United States entered World War II. Steel could only be used for war production and the company sought government contracts. They changed their toy production to wooden vehicles, calling them Buddy L Victory Toys. In 1948 Richard Keats joined the company. He took over leadership in 1976. By the time the decision was made in 1968 to relocate the company to Neosho, Missouri, more than 100 million Buddy L toys had been produced here in East Moline. In 1990 Keats sold the company to SLM International marking the end of Buddy L as an independent company. There is something distinctive and realistic about a Buddy L toy that sets it apart from the multitude of other mechanical toys. Over the years they have become very collectable not only to individuals, but to museums as well. A concrete mixer is part of the collection at the Smithsonian Museum of American History in Washington, D.C. One can also be found in the sun porch at RICHS! Buddy L toys are included in the exhibit "Play: The Story of Toys" at the Putnam Museum in Davenport, Iowa. There can be no doubt that Buddy L toys have lived up to Fred Lundhal's original goal of creating a toy both durable enough and imaginative enough to captivate his son.
