## **GRAND NATIONAL MEET MEETING Education Center, Moline, IL – September 21, 2022**



Getting to meet participants that are enthusiastic and passionate about their prized automobile makes the effort extremely satisfying. I cannot thank our national headquarters enough for the support that I needed to ensure that each entry had a fair chance at achieving the desired award. For me personally, the AACA Judging System has provided me exposure to some of the finest automobiles and most interesting people over the years. It was a thrill to have three Pebble Beach winning cars amongst our show entries including one of the AACA National Zenith Award winners. Once again, the MVR provided a top-notch national event that resulted in numerous compliments and expressions of happiness over a well-organized event. Our meet initially received 156 entries registered for show day. Our "No Show" list yielded 10 vehicles, mostly from long distance travelers. 146 vehicles were judged or evaluated, 8 in DPC, 22 in HPOF, and 116 in class judging.
