We are in need of volunteers to help run the show. Please contact Mark Lousberg the show chairman to volunteer to work in one of the following areas, Trailer Parking, Event Marketing Team, and Merchandise.

GRAND NATIONAL MEET MEETING WITH VISIT QUAD CITIES Stoney Creek Inn – 3:00 p.m., Wednesday, October 26, 2022

Mary gave overview of Grand National Meet – dates, expected numbers, schedule of events, etc. Stated the following as needs we have:

Need for local and long distance publicity of our event.

Tourism funding for this large event.

Help with city of Bettendorf staff to assist in traffic control along State Street,

Help with FB outreach.

Securing any additional parking areas around the hotel/convention center.

Security issues with trailers so vulnerable to State Street traffic.

Means to transport visitors to/from Modern Woodmen ballpark for home baseball game on Friday evening, August 11. Clair will look into some transport carriers costs.

Help with printing Program Book

Boat ride is scheduled for Friday evening, Oct. 11th with boat coming directly to Bettendorf dock. We may need some parking areas for local boat riders coming to board.

Visit Quad Cities Responses to our needs:

Funding is limited for events, but staff will look into any possibilities.

Staff will have brochures and maps of area sites available during the meet.

They will send out press releases to various print media to publicize the meet and will setup T.V. spots to publicize event.

Staff will help Fred with Facebook advertising that will increase the coverage of FB postings. He will meet with staff to pursue this assistance.

Staff offered to assist in meetings with Bettendorf staff and police to secure adequate protection for vehicles using Bettendorf streets to/from trailers and show field.

Suggested we consider paying for a shuttle to/from any parking areas on show day for visitors, especially if distance or terrain is difficult.

Same suggestion as above RE shuttle to/from ball field Aug. 11. Shuttle normally costs \$1,000 for a full day for 52 passenger coach. This would need to be shared with all ticketholders. Staff will send out request for bids to several carriers in the area.

They can send out RFP for booklet printing as meet draws closer. Modern Woodmen can print booklets for \$0 cost. We will look into this further.

Additional interaction will help facilitate the meet. We agreed to meet again at a later date.

GRAND NATIONAL MEET MEETING Education Center, Moline, IL – October 19, 2022

Hospitality Options during Grand National are as follows: Thursday Evening, Aug. 10- River Bandits baseball game with possibility of renting a private box, with tickets at \$12 ea. If the group is 10-49 people. The requirements are to reserve far in advance with ½ payment required this year and final payment required in February of 2023. Suggestion to rent vans or small bus to transport guests to ballpark.

Mary Bartemeyer reported that there is no secure room with A/C which is close to the show field for the Judge's Administration people to work. Discussion involved possible renting of trailers with power to provide what is needed. Mark will source some possibilities.

Food trucks will be allowed on the site for meals during Saturday, Aug. 12.

Visit Quad Cities will be asked to provide funding and promotional help to publicize the meet.

The AACA Wisconsin Region is hosting the Spring Midwest Nationals in Racine in 2023, which could increase participation in Grand National from those car owners who win a senior award.

Annette Bartemeyer will help design the dash plaque, judge's chip and the Meet Book Cover.

Possible book cover photo of new bridge taken at night. Fred will contact Ron Browning to see about taking this type of photo. We need a theme for the meet.

Fred has asked Dave Bowman of Charlotte, NC to be the Assistant Chief Judge for this meet. Other judging staff will be added by Fred as the numbers of cars come in.

Gary Gleason will send out an e-mail to those MVR members who showed a car during the August meet that will entitle them to one free year of MVR dues so they can adjust their dues payment.

The trifold needs to be developed and sent to National ASAP.



Mother Nature provided stunning colors for the cruise.








